- **Best Active Ageing Program: Still Firing – Journeys through Sculptures and Clay**

A partnership initiated by Emmy Monash Aged Care with Duldig Studios and Bialik College, Still Firing is a creative sensory program focused on clay sculpture techniques and personal expression. Residents learned new artistic skills, fostered intergenerational friendships with the Bialik students and developed an appreciation of shared values and community wellbeing.

- **Best Silver Architecture: Emmy Monash Gandel House**

It's no surprise that the architectural design of Gandel House has attracted international attention since its completion. We have created a community hub that encourages socialisation across generations, stimulates inclusiveness and offers opportunities for meaningful engagement. The architectural design allows for an abundance of natural light via vertically integrated inviting courtyards and themed lifestyle rooms to enhance interest based activities.
